In accordance with § 2 (4) and § 64 of the Act on Higher Education Institutions of the State of North Rhine-Westphalia (Hochschulgesetz – HG) of 16 September 2014 (Law and Ordinance Gazette NRW p. 547), as last amended by the law of 7 April 2017 (Law and Ordinance Gazette NRW p. 414), the University of Siegen has issued the following subject-specific regulations:

Scope of these regulations

Using the Internship Regulations (2013) for the Bachelor and Master's Programmes of Faculty I: School of Arts and Humanities at the University of Siegen in its currently valid version as a basis, these subject-specific internship regulations govern the Master's programme "Roads to Democracies"

- Historical and Contemporary Perspectives on Politics and Culture at the University of Siegen.

§ 2

Internship certificates

- (1) If an internship is completed as part of the Master's programme "Roads to Democracies Historical and Contemporary Perspectives on Politics and Culture", this must be verified in the form of the certificates stated in the Internship Regulations.
- (2) The validity of the certificates in accordance with the requirements specified in more detail in § 4 of the Internship Regulations will be checked and confirmed by the Internship Office. If the certificates are invalid or not provided in accordance with the requirements specified in § 4, the student will be notified about this situation by the Internship Office. In cases of doubt, a final decision will be made by the Internship Committee. The elected chairperson will make a decision in urgent cases.
- (3) In cases of doubt regarding the relevance of the intended internship to the study programme, the chairperson of the relevant departmental examination board will advise the Internship Office or the Internship Committee.

§ 3

Internship

The internship in the Master's programme "Roads to Democracies - Historical and Contemporary Perspectives on Politics and Culture" must be performed in an area related to the study programme or in a company department that is appropriate to the themes/content of the subjects of history, political sciences and sociology. It is possible to complete the internship, for example, in: international and intergovernmental organisations and non-governmental organisations; public and private education and research institutions; cultural institutions; publishing houses, agencies and media outlets for international and intercultural communication; parties, associations, political and cultural foundations and other organisations under private law and internationally oriented companies. In the event that the relevance of an intended internship to the study programme is not obvious, the process described in § 2 (3) of these subject-specific regulations will apply.

§ 4

Enactment and publication

These subject-specific regulations come into force on 1 October 2016. They were published in the official notifications of the University of Siegen ("Amtliche Mitteilungen der Universität Siegen").
